BABY BOOMERS: APPLY ONLINE FOR MEDICARE

This January marks a historic moment: our Nation's first baby boomers are turning 65.

For many baby boomers, it's time to hit the computer. Even if you have decided to wait until after you are age 65 to apply for retirement benefits, most people should start getting Medicare coverage at age 65.

If you would like to begin your Medicare coverage when you first become eligible, it's important that you apply within three months of reaching age 65. But don't worry about the time and effort it will take to apply for Medicare — it's fast and easy! You can do it online at www.socialsecurity.gov/medicareonly in as little as 10 minutes.

Why apply online for Medicare? Because it's fast, easy, and secure. You don't need an appointment and you can avoid waiting in traffic or in line. As long as you have ten minutes to spare, you have time to complete and submit your online Medicare application.

People who started receiving Social Security retirement or disability benefits before age 65 do not need to apply; they will be automatically enrolled in Medicare.

Adoption Tax Credits

Adoption Tax Credits including Tax Credit Carry Forwards are now FULLY REFUNDABLE in tax year 2010 According to IRS Notice 2010-66

According to Marilyn E. Brookens, Associate Chief Counsel for IRS Income Tax and Accounting Division, "The adoption tax credit is now effective for the 2010 tax year a FULLY REFUNDABLE TAX CREDIT under Section 10909 of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act. Taxpayers with adoption tax credit carry forward to tax year 2010 can expect to free those tax credits up and get cash as a tax refund."

This means that the tax refunds for 2010 tax year will include payment in their tax refund for all adoption tax credits carried forward to 2010. In order to qualify you will have had to submit IRS form 8839 <http://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/f8839.pdf> in all previous years that the credit was carried from.

APEX Meeting November 11th and 12th 2010, Alexandria Virginia:

- I. Sheri Jacobs of M Group LLC marketing discussed survey of public on Enrolled Agent as a name. Their firm has been hired for the preliminary research to see about a possible name change and rebranding effort. At this point their survey shows what would be expected that most people do not know what an Enrolled Agent is.
- II. Fast Forward Academy presented their SEE program. Linda Ward EA gave them our information for further discussion with them regarding a partnership for website advertising.
- III. CPE sponsorship presentation by Nadine McPhail from OPR. At this point she is only speaking to requirements up to September 2010. After that time there may be changes in the program but she would not speculate on what those changes may be. At this time COSEA is all setup correctly to give programs until September 2010. It is my opinion from the discussion that OPR is softening their position regarding CPE sponsors and their programs. I would assume they will have the details of the new program at the next APEX meeting.
- IV. The following program updates were given by the state leaders:
 - A. California—Booth in a box for their chapters to use to do Public Relations (sign/table cover/handouts, etc...) Good for college job and information fairs as well as when we go to places like to PASC meetings and seminars.
 - B. North Carolina—Did some awesome TV spots and Dial in programs on the local stations. Hopefully they will be able to post the video under samples and examples on the NAEA website Affiliate Resources
 - C. North Carolina—Has a Return Preparer Registration information class Power Point. We will try to get this and get it to our members who teach at the local colleges.
- V. NAEA Staff Presentations:
 - A. Jackie Gellner—Marketing on Social networking sights. Facebook Fan Page/LinkedIn/Blogs/Twitter. Contact her to see how this could work locally.
 - B. Sean Burgess—Web Manager is working on a major website redesign. Target date is Early March. It was suggested that he not put up a new website during tax season but test it when members will have more time to get familiar with it. Web board is also being upgraded.
 - C. Holli Jones—Presentations in a box are calling for speakers. Hope to have them up early next year.
- VI. David Williams from the IRS spoke regarding Return Preparer Registration:
 - A. He will head the new department for registered return preparers
 - B. Definition of Return Preparer: Substantive judgment over the return or substantially all of the return.
 - C. Working on exempting people who work for EA/CPA/Attorney firms from CPE testing requirements if they are under control of EA/CPA/Attorney.
 - D. Proposed around \$30 for EA renewal fee to account for overlap of licensing requirements (this would be a substantial reduction)
 - E. The \$64.25 yearly PTIN fee will fluctuate as they adjust for cost to administer program
 - F. Said he will promote Enrolled Agents in the new listings of Return Preparers.

FTD COUPONS BEING ELIMINATED!

Consistent with its prior announcements, the IRS intends to stop accepting Federal Tax Deposit (FTD) coupons for tax deposits after December 31, 2010. Payments will be made online or by telephone using EFTPS (Electronic Federal Tax Payment System). Some banks have already issued notices informing their customers that they have stopped or when they will stop accepting FTD coupons. Information on EFTPS, including enrollment, is available at the www.eftps.gov. With EFTPS, payments can be made online or by telephone 24 hours a day, seven days a week from virtually any location. Payments can be scheduled up to 120 days in advance of the payment date. Business who pay a minimal amount of tax may be able to make their payment with the related tax return instead of using EFTPS.

Revised Local Jurisdiction Codes used on DR 0100 returns now available

The publication “Location/Jurisdiction Codes for Sales Tax Filing” (DR 0800) has been updated to show the six-digit county and city codes that retailers should be using on their DR 0100 Colorado sales tax returns. The codes listed in the current publication are in the correct format of NN-NNNN. In future versions, we will add “0206” generic designations of unincorporated areas.

Please check the DR 0800 publication for any jurisdiction code changes or updates prior to filing a sales tax return. In the future, please use the appropriate codes for your business location(s) as shown in the DR 0800. If you are using a sales tax coupon booklet or forms you have received from the Department of Revenue with the jurisdiction codes already on the documents, you may continue to use those codes.

NAEA has formed a new membership category. 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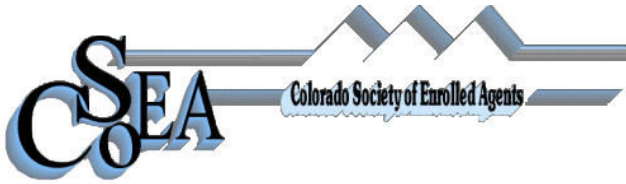
Have You Updated Your Profile Lately?

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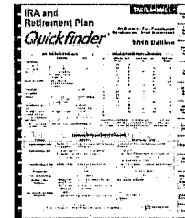
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
